Course Title: UAWEB330: Web Page Editing: Adobe Dreamweaver CS3

Course Length: 3 days

Instructional Methodology: Instructor-led computer lab with hands-on exercises

Prerequisites: Familiarity with Web technologies and various Web browsers, and a basic working knowledge of HTML, JavaScript, and CSS. Also helpful is a basic understanding of design and media applications, such as FreeHand and Fireworks.

Course Description: Web developers need to create both individual pages as well as fit files into an entire site structure. You may have some knowledge of the underlying HTML structure of Web pages and affiliated technologies such as JavaScript and Cascading Style Sheets, but haven't yet used Adobe Dreamweaver to apply these to live sites. In this course, participants learn to take full advantage of Adobe Dreamweaver's efficient interface for developing a static site with text, images, media, navigation elements, and forms. By applying Adobe Dreamweaver's site management tools, participants ensure that their sites work as intended for the widest possible audience. Target audience for this course includes individuals working in advertising agencies, marketing agencies, and groups involved in intranet and extranet production.

Course Objective: Participants will use Dreamweaver's graphical page-building interface to efficiently develop and manage static Web sites featuring text, graphics, multimedia, navigation, and form elements.
